Local Action Programme

As a Local Action Programme for 2012 SWYAA – VEN is going to support three rural schools for Primary Children "Escuela Bolivariana de Sicarigua" in Lara State, "Escuela Integral El Palomo" in Bolívar State and E.B.E "Luis Castro" in Vargas State. Research has been conducted in order to identify the needs of these communities. As a result SWYAA –Venezuela is going to coordinate a series of capacity building workshops in following areas:

- Sustainability and Recycling
- Cultural Heritage and Intercultural Education
- Health and Nutrition
- Economics and Administration
- Ethnicity and Human Rights





In addition, in order to attend other pressing needs in these communities the SWYAA – VEN is currently collecting donations for medicines and educational resources.
